Christa Canitz, Editor, at florilegium@unb.ca. Submissions are refereed doubleblind by international and Canadian specialists. Papers must not contain any indication of authorship and must not be published or submitted elsewhere. Manuscripts should normally not exceed 8,000-9,000 words, including footnotes and bibliography, and should be formatted according to Chicago style. Papers may be written in

either English or French. All submissions will be acknowledged. Please include both email and postal addresses in the cover message.

Any manuscripts intended for the upcoming special issue on Medieval Translation: Theory and Practice must be submitted no later than 15 December.

"Benedictine Vernacular: Language and Authority in a Fourteenth-Century Trilingual Psalter." The committee was impressed by the way this presentation challenged a pervasive view of psalters and their translation by arguing that the psalter in English could offer a mediation of the Latin text for both monastic and lay leaders. The presentation supported this argument through carefully defined terms, distinguishing between mediation and translation, and offering a nuanced reading of the psalter's use in Norwich. The presentation also made effective use of annotated images of the manuscript. Overall, this presentation achieved a remarkable balance between close attention to detail and the broader implications, ultimately revealing how insight into the Surtees Psalter might change how we think about psalters and their translation more generally.
